Accession Overview

Anthony Bondi was closely involved with the Las Vegas arts community from the late 1990s onwards. His interest in art was paralleled with a respect for history and he viewed the development of the Las Vegas arts community through this lens. As the community developed, its progress was widely covered in local print media. Bondi collated and saved these articles, creating a curated collection of newspaper and magazine clippings spanning 25 years, entitled "Las Vegas arts in print media, 1990-2015". It contains more than 750 articles consisting of 1292 pages that are segmented into 44

chapters. Many clippings herald from publications that no longer exist, are not found online and for

which there are no known archives.

This now serves as a fascinating insight into the Las Vegas arts community.
